2. Purpose and objectives of the educational discipline

Purpose of study: the formation of the language culture and language competence as an integral part and indispensable sign of education and professionalism of a young professional.

Objectives: Formation of socio-cultural competence of future foreign professors in the field of educational and professional communication in Ukrainian language; strong motivation to Ukrainian language communication in the process of professional training and positive attitude to Ukrainian language as the language of instruction; professional and communicative competence in types of speech activities (reading, listening, writing, speech and monologue activities); ability to self-diagnose and diagnose the achievements of other future foreign professions in Ukrainian-language professional training.

According to the requirements of the educational and professional program students should achieve such **competences:**

- GC 4 The competence to communicate in the state language both verbally and in writing to carry out effective professional communication;
 - GC 5. competence to communicate in a foreign language;
- PC 14. Competence for further study with a high level of autonomy, constant improvement of the level of information culture.

Interdisciplinary links: the study of the discipline is based on the disciplines "Foreign Language" and provides for further communication of students during the preparation and protection of diploma works, internships in modern enterprises and institutions of Ukraine.

Module 1. Morphological norms of Ukrainian language as a sign of special competence.

Theme 1.Nominative case. Nominative predicate; subject, which is compared to another subject(*ніж*); *number* (*один*, *одна*, *одне*, *одні*, *два/дві*, *три*, *чотири*).

Theme 2.Genitive Case. Genitive indication: a) without an abbreviation: time of action, date; b) with an abbreviation: in relation to(uodo), in accordance with reference to an object, person, document;do, nicns, 3, 3 ... do, hanpukihui, niduac, enpodobsc, npomscom - time of action.

Theme 3.Dative case. Dative case: a) without (person as object of action; person as addressee of action - potential subject); b) with a preposition (всупереч (усупереч), наперекір – допустовість).

Theme 4.Accusativecase.Theaccusativecase: a) withoutapreposition (кількість, міра; міра простору); b) with a preposition (незважаючи на – допустовість).

Theme 5.Instrumental case. Instrumental case: a) without instrument (time of action); b) with instrument (3 - ocoбa-napmнep, cniвучасник diï; 3 (i3, 3i) - method of action).

Theme 6. The Prepositional Case. The case (in (y), on - the object of action (with the verbs *упевнюватися*, *сумніватися*, *помилятися*, *розумітися*, *знатися*, *наполягати*, *трунтуватися*, *зосереджуватися та ін*); *in* (y), *on*, *about*, *on* - *the time of action*).

Theme 7. Changes of pronouns. Use of negative and indefinite pronouns with prepositions.

Theme 8. Adjective. Active and passive adjectives. Adjective expressions.

Theme 9. Adverb. Interpersonal relations (past and present) of Adverbes.

Theme 10.Conjunction. The conjunctions (причинові, наслідковий, часові, умовні, мети, допустові, порівняльні). Synonymy and omonimy of conjunctions.

Module control. Module control work № 1.

Content module 2. Mastery of syntactic norms of Ukrainian language as a sign of professional competence.

Theme 1. Simple sentences. Single-part sentences: nominative; definite-personal; indefinite-personal; general-personal; non-personal.

Theme 2. Expression of the grammatical subject. Ways of expressing a grammatical subject: numeral (its equivalent) in the nominative case and noun in the genitive form; pronoun in the nominative case and noun or pronoun in the plural case; noun in the nominative case and noun in the instrumental case with the preposition3.

Theme 3. Expression of the logical subject. Ways of expressing the logical subject: nouns and pronouns in the form of the instrumental case.

Theme 4. Coordination of grammatical subject and predicate. Rules of coordination of grammatical subject and predicate: conditional-grammatical coordination (subject-infinitive and verb of connection in the form of 3 persons singular of the present tense or middle gender of the past); associative-grammatical coordination (in gender and number depending on the main word).

Theme 5. Ways of expressing logical and semantic relations in a sentence. Ways of expressing logical-semantic relations in a sentence: circumstantial relations

(spatial: case and preposition-case forms of nouns, adverbs; temporal: case and preposition-case forms of nouns, adverbs and adverbial inflections; causal: case and prepositional forms of nouns, adverbs, adverbs and adverbial inflections; conditions: case and prepositional-case forms of nouns, adverbs and adverbial inversions; infinitives; admissible (singular and prepositional-singular forms of nouns)).

Theme 6. Ways of expressing modal relations in a sentence. Ways of expressing modal relations in a sentence: probability (assumptions with a high degree of probability; assumptions with a medium degree of probability; assumptions with a low degree of probability).

Theme 7. The order of words in a sentence. Circumstances of mode of action, measure and degree - predicate. A predicate is a highly controlled application or circumstance. Word order and actual sentence structure.

Theme 8. Complex sentence. Theme 10.Means of achieving structural and compositional integrity of a complex sentence. Means of achieving the structural and compositional integrity of a complex sentence: A. The order of predicative parts (free - the events described in the sentence occur simultaneously and independently). B. Lexical means (reinforcing particles, pronouns, adverbs; personal and indicative pronouns in the postpositional part; antonyms, words of one thematic group, repetition, synonyms; special words that fix the order of predicative parts: *cnoчатку*, *nomim*, *згодом*, *враз*, *panmom* common members of the sentence.

Theme 11.Direct and indirect speech. Rules of transformation of direct speech into indirect: use of conjunctions, connecting words, particles; change of personal, possessive pronouns and personal forms and verb forms; change the order of words. Implicit-direct speech: the interpenetration of authorial and direct speech.

The semester control (exam) is carried out in case of refusal of the student from points of current testing and in the presence of the admission to examination. During the semester exam, the student has the opportunity to receive a maximum of 100 points.

The ticket for the exam consists of two points, the maximum number of points for each of which is 50 points, and together is 100 points.

9.2. Qualitative assessment criteria

Necessary amount of knowledge to obtain a positive assessment:

know the norms of modern Ukrainian literary language and the rules of proficiency at the II intermediate level (B2) proficiency in Ukrainian as a foreign language; typical syntactic constructions of scientific and technical background of scientific style of speech; lexico-grammatical features of technical discourse texts;

Required amount of skills to obtain a positive assessment:

be able to take into account the types of speech situations and their non-verbal components: communicative goals of the partner, his personal characteristics and expected reactions; be able to listen to the interlocutor and adjust their own discursive strategy in the course of interaction; find in the catalog and on the Internet the necessary texts-sources of professionally significant information in accordance with the communicative task; compile a list of source texts; be able in the process of viewing the text material to determine which of the texts reflects certain sections of the topic (problems); find the necessary information in the texts (data, examples, facts, arguments) in accordance with the task; find in the text components that require detailed study; to form and express their own attitude to the information they perceive; draw conclusions based on it, evaluate its objectivity, novelty, problems, theoretical and practical significance, prospects; use paralinguistic information (facial expressions, gestures, articulation, etc.) to understand the interlocutor's remarks (interlocutors); highlight key information and reformulate it; borrow phrases from a lecturer's speech or printed text; perform compression operations: suppression (eliminate insignificant information) and compression (shorten the text without losing information).

9.3 Criteria for evaluating student work during the semester

Satisfactory (60-74). Have a minimum amount of knowledge and skills on theoretical and applied material from the course "Ukrainian as a foreign language". Orient in the structure of educational and scientific text, perform practical tasks at a satisfactory level. Be able to prepare an abstract in scientific activities, information for public speaking in professional activities; use etiquette norms of professional communication.

Good (75-89). It is good to know all the basic concepts and components of the course "Ukrainian as a foreign language"; the specifics of the organization and functioning of the components of the text. The student must competently perform all practical tasks of the teacher to prepare a report in scientific activities, public speaking and others at the appropriate level. Be able to explain and justify the answers to the teacher's questions by giving facts and examples. Apply analytical thinking when performing practical tasks.

Excellent (90-100). Perfectly possess theoretical and applied knowledge of the course "Ukrainian as a foreign language": basic concepts, components of the text, as well as have knowledge of the specifics of professional communication in the professional field and apply them in practical work in full. The answers should differ in logic, consistency, creativity and analytical thinking in the presentation of material from the teacher's questions. The student must demonstrate additional knowledge acquired as a result of self-study of the topics being studied. Applied works must be characterized by accuracy and literacy.
